Draft Assessment of the Parish of Fenny Bentley



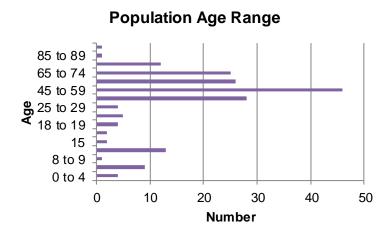
Fenny Bentley is located to the west of the A515, providing it with good access to Ashbourne 2 miles to the south. The Conservation Area was designated in 1997 and describes the village as one of the most southerly villages in the National Park. The village has a surface flowing stream 'Bentley Brook' running to the south, 'the village's name is derived from 'fennig' meaning 'marshy' and 'beonet' and 'leah' which signify a 'bent-grass clearing'.' (Conservation Area Appraisal).

Fenny Bentley is located within the slopes and valleys with woodland area of the Derbyshire Peak Fringe as described within the Peak District Landscape Characteristic Assessment (LSAP 2009).

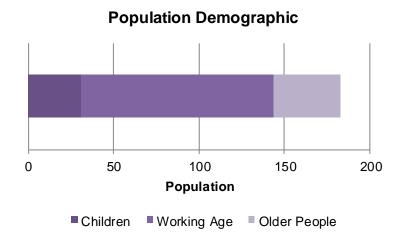

Population and demographics

The parish of Fenny Bentley has a population of 183 (2011 census). The graph below shows that 45-59 year olds make up the largest percentage of the population.

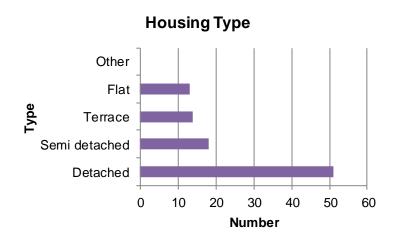


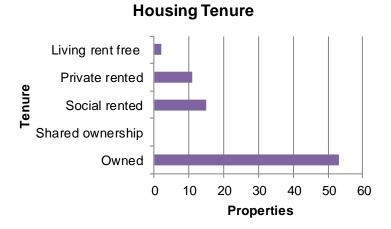
The purpose of the graph below is to give an indication of the balance of children, adult workers and retired persons living within the parishes. Whilst there is no longer a retirement age, the graph below uses an assumed working age of 18-65 year olds.



Housing

A sustainable community relies on a mix of housing to attract a mix of people. Below is a breakdown of types and tenures. Detached properties make up 53.1% of properties, semi-detached 18.8%, terraced properties 14.6%, and flats 13.5% of properties in Fenny Bentley parish.



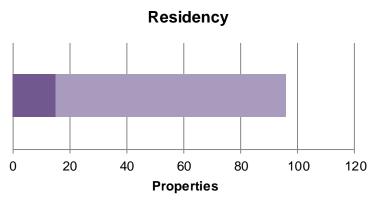


The majority of properties, 65.4%, are owner occupied either with or without a mortgage (no shared ownership). Renting either privately (13.6%) or through a housing association (18.5%) accounts for 32.1% of the housing stock.

There are no care homes in the parish.

Residency

Second homes or holidays lets are a growing concern in the Peak District National Park. Whilst they can provide holiday accommodation to support tourism, a high proportion can alter the dynamics of a village to its detriment. Of the 96 residential properties located in Fenny Bentley Parish, 81 have a 'usual resident', meaning that they are inhabited. There are 15 properties with no 'usual resident' and are therefore second homes, holiday lets, or vacant properties. This equates to 15.6% of properties in the Parish.

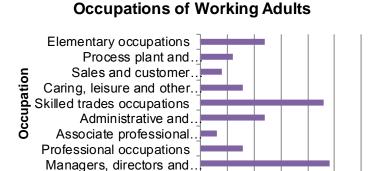


■ No Ususal Residents ■ Usual residents

Employment

Of the total population of Fenny Bentley parish, 73.6% are economically active in either full time, part time work or ad hoc working and 26.4% are economically inactive (19.3% of the total population are retired).

The following graph sets out the occupations of the economically active population. It shows that managers, directors and senior professions and skilled trades occupations are the most common in the area.

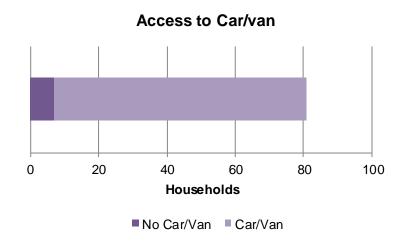

Over the last 5 years 11 planning applications have been approved.

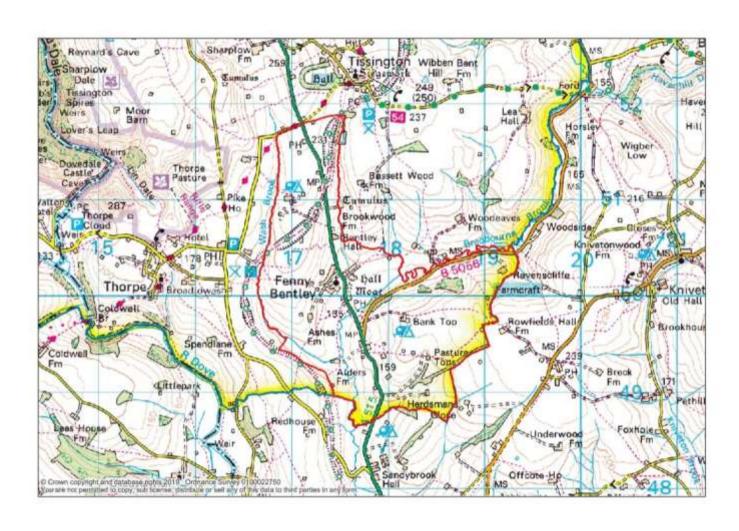

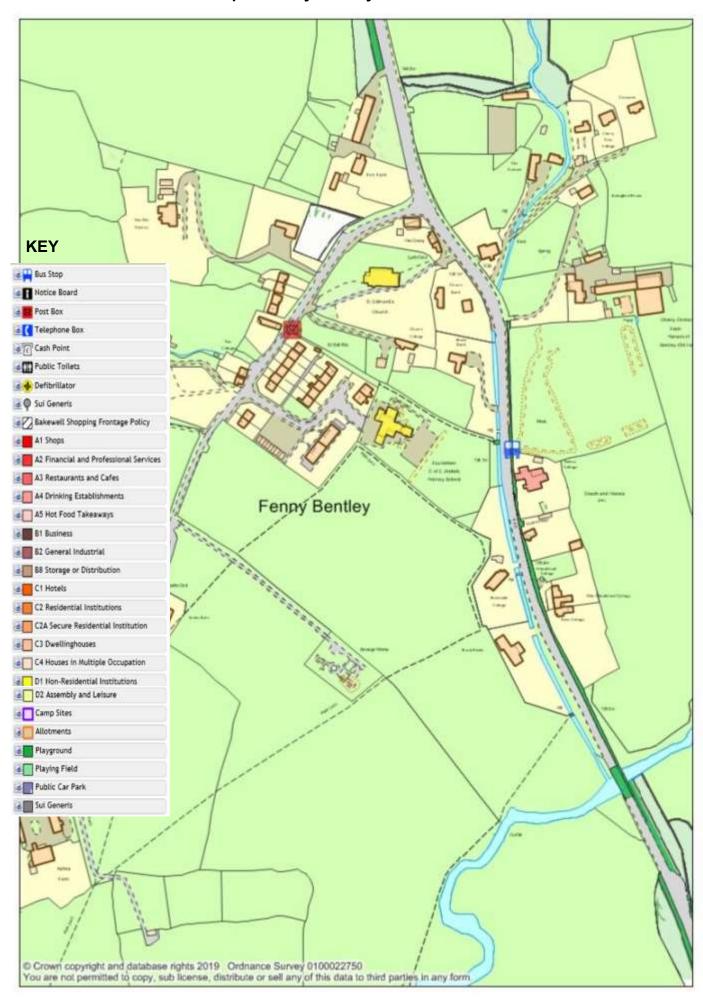
